

# PUPIL PREMIUM GRANT REPORT 2020 – 2021

The year 2020 to 2021 was interrupted and curtailed by coronavirus and this meant that we did not have as many trips or educational enrichment as we normally would.

The data above shows that, on the whole, the strategies that are in place to address the needs of the Pupil Premium (PP) group are effective in securing expected or better progress from previous assessment points. Attainment still lags a little way behind the “all pupil” group although some of the PP group are only just below expected and will be supported in 2021-22 to get to reach the expected standard.
